



PARKING VIOLATION NOTICE

YOU ARE PARKED:

- in a space reserved for individuals with disabilities, and your vehicle does not display a disability parking certificate or disability license plate**
- in an access aisle used by individuals with disabilities**
- blocking access to a curb cut used by individuals with disabilities**



Your Policy, Training and Technical Resource

Under Minnesota Law, a person shall not park a motor vehicle in, or obstruct access to, a parking space designated for disability parking or the associated access aisle, on public or private property. Parking in or obstructing access to a transfer zone designated for people with disabilities is also prohibited (MN Statute 169.346). You could get a ticket, and a fine of up to \$200.
