It is against the law to fail to remove architectural barriers in existing facilities when it is readily achievable to do so. It is also discriminatory to, on the basis of a disability, deny the opportunity of the individual or class to participate in or benefit from the goods, services, facilities, privileges, advantages, or accommodations of a business [Minnesota Statute 363A.11 and the Americans with Disabilities Act Title III].
